# 38<sup>th</sup> Constitutional Convention Delegates Notice of Nominations and Elections

Nominations and Elections will be taken for Delegates to the UAW 38<sup>th</sup> Constitutional Convention, which will be held July 25-28, 2022 in Detroit, Michigan.

Anyone who has been a member in good standing for 12 months immediately preceding the first day of the month in which the Convention is held (in this case July 1st 2022) and a member in good standing of this Local Union for 3 months immediately preceding the first day of the month in which the Convention is held (in this case April 1st 2022) is eligible to run as a Delegate.

Those nominated and not present at these meetings will have three (3) working days to accept in writing to a member of their Election Committee or at the UAW Office.

The two (2) top vote-getters of each Election will serve as Delegates. The next two (2) top vote-getters will serve as 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Alternates in the event the Delegates cannot attend.

With proper notice the Election Polling Times will be extended if overtime is scheduled.

We felt it necessary to include an article in this month's R&F paper regarding collections for retirees and those with misfortune. It is a shameful excuse used by the same people every single collection that they are carrying no money, and/or that they do not know the person (which should not make a difference), and often say they will catch us later. (You know who you are!) Some outright refuse and/or avoid us! They make no effort to find their steward later in the day or the next to donate. The memory cannot be that short! Our cell numbers are available to anyone asking, as are the cell phone numbers of most stewards; call us and we will come find you. Two retirements collections are taken every two weeks on average at Lennox, unless the misfortune occurs of a member's death, death of a spouse or child, house fire, etc., but there is SOME type of collection every two weeks, usually on Thursdays. \$1.00 per person, \$2.00 per collection cycle for retirements and other. Please make it a point to have a couple of dollar bills on or near your person (or we can usually make change, or we will return), in your toolbox, or ask a friend to borrow \$2.00. Sign your name on the collection sheet and come find us later (that day or next). \$4.00 per month is not too much to ask and is unlikely to affect anyone but think of what it means to the person receiving it! Find it in your conscience to donate to these retirees. They have all been in your shoes! They all deserve \$100 per person, whether we know them personally or not. YOU are THE Union; WE together are A Union! They are our UAW Sisters and Brothers, and many are friends! Give freely to your stewards and chief stewards taking up these collections. Make the effort to donate! Encourage your coworkers to donate. And most importantly, keep in that the next collection going around the plant for someone's misfortune may very well be for you, your spouse, family member, or friend! In Solidarity.




