

# 2022 Reports to The Membership

### President

### Jim Chance

In January, negotiations took place between Unit 3 and Lydall Sealing Solutions. A tentative agreement was brought to the membership on January 31<sup>st</sup> and was rejected. After returning to negotiations, another tentative agreement was brought before the membership on April 18<sup>th</sup>. The contract was ratified. The multi-tier wage scales will be closed up by the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the agreement.

We sent some of our CAP delegates to the National CAP Convention in Washington, D.C. in May. They were able to lobby with some of our representatives on the PRO Act, prescription drug costs, striking workers' health care, an electric vehicle tax incentives.

Several repairs and upkeep were made to our Union Hall in 2022. We replaced the roof after it was damaged by the derecho in 2020. A new exterior paint job was also added to spruce up the peeling paint. New siding was installed on the garage. The dead ash trees were removed from the North side of our property. The rest of the trees were trimmed up. Thank you to all who donated time for the tree removal.

Our convention delegates attended the 38<sup>th</sup> Constitutional Convention in July in Detroit, MI. Congratulations to Jason Helton, Greg Oetker and Matt Nichols for being elected as delegates. Thank you for representing our membership.

Several of our members attended events at the Pat Greathouse Center in Ottawa, IL. throughout the year. We had representatives at the Spring and Fall Conferences, both summer school sessions, Skilled Trades Conference, Veteran's Conference, and the IPS Conference, just to name a few. We also attended other workshops there. Our retirees were also active with the Regional Retiree events.

Our local continues to be active in Community Services n Marshalltown and surrounding communities. There is a long list of activities that our members donate time and money to. We were also able to participate in the Oktemberfest parade. I was glad to see a good turnout.

Our local was able to start becoming more active again in 2022 after some of our activities were slowed during the pandemic. We look forward to a great 2023.


